NEW BUSINESS



1. It was agreed that another Saturday work party was needed at the Club station. Doug Freeman was requested to schedule it.
2. George Campbell's termination left us with no representative on the LA Council of Amateur Radio Clubs. It was noted, however, that Don Etheredge, K6UMV, attends Council meetings regularly as Assistant Section Communications Manager for Los Angeles, ARRL. It was ~~moved~~ (Dews), seconded (Thompson) and voted to request Don to also serve as the TRW/ARC representative, offering to waive his Club dues as long as: a) he represents the TRW/ARC; and: b) he is an ARRL official. Bill Dews was requested to contact Don in this regard.

NOTE: Prior to publication of these minutes, Don accepted this responsibility. The Secretary will write to the LA Council of Amateur Radio Clubs, identifying Don as an alternate representative.
