OLD BUSINESS (AND SOME NEW)

- ACTION THOMPSON
1. Paul Weisz, having volunteered to fill the Vice Presidency vacancy, made the nominating committee's job much easier. The April CROSS TALK will contain a ballot to make it official.
 2. April program not yet firm. Paul Weisz will inform CROSS TALK editor of information.
 3. Bill Thompson announced that he will be unable to continue as CROSS TALK editor beyond the April issue. Doug Heydon will fill in on an interim basis, until a new "permanant" sucker is found.

 9. Treasurer Halligan reported that the recent station upgrading left us with a balance of only \$90.27 on hand.


