TEN-METER BAND-OPENING CONTEST: Reprinted from June, 1971 "WYARC Random Wire", by Way of "Didi-dumdum-didi"

The West Valley Amateur Radio Club of Woodland Hills, California announces the fourth annual Ten Meter Band-Opening Contest, the purpose of which is to encourage activity on and mark the seasonal opening of the ten meter band, as well as to allow a study of ten meter propagation.

- 1. The contest is open to all radio amateurs. All contacts must be made on the ten meter amateur band. No cross-band contacts are allowed.
- 2. The contest period is from 1300 GMT, August 21 to 0100 GMT, August 23, 1971.
- 3. Work each station once, regardless of mode. Cross-mode contacts are valid.
- Exchange signal reports. Stations not in the contest may be contacted for contest credit if signal reports are exchanged.
- 5. Score as follows: ADD one point for each station worked plus one point for each state worked plus one point for each country worked plus three points for each continent worked plus one point for each WVARC member worked.

Use the Official ARRL Countries List. WVARC members will identify themselves as such. Note that some contacts are worth more points since they fall into a number of these categories.

- 6. Logs should be legible and should include: date and time (GMT), station worked, his QTH (state or country), and signal reports exchanged, as well as a summary sheet which shows scoring, your call and QTH, and any comments and suggestions. Include SASE for results. Log forms are available from the WVARC Contest Committee for an SASE.
- 7. Certificates will be awarded to the highest scorer in each state and foreign country.
- Send logs on or before September 23, 1971, to WVARC Contest Committee, c/o Matt Futterman, WB6KPN, 23320 Canzonet Street, Woodland Hills, Calif. 91364.
