AMSAT OSCAR TEST

The JPL Amateur Radio Club is assisting the AMSAT Corporation in a planned exercise of the DJ4ZC/DJ5KQ Euro-Oscar Translator to be flown as a portion of the AMSAT-OSCAR-B Satellite. The test will involve a staewide aircraft flight of the transponder scheduled for Saturday September 8, 1973.

The transponder is a 10 to 14 watt PEP linear translator which accepts up-link signals between 432.125 and 432.175 MHz, and re-transmits them between 145.975 and 145.925 MHz.

If you are planning to take part in this activity, please let me know so you can be included in the planning effort.
