— At the last general meeting, purchase of a Drake 2B receiver or equivalent for our embryo RTTY facility was authorized (by acclamation). We are now actively looking for such a receiver in the \$150 price class, and will start system synthesis as soon as we find one. If you want to help put this new club station capability together, call Jerry Dean (X 61612) or Roger Trapp (X 51583).

— Field Day is right in among us, and preparations are well under way. Right now the big requirement is for people: operators, loggers, roustabouts for setup and teardown, cooks and spectators. Last year, the TRW/ARC (29 operators) came in third in this class behind W8TO/8 (46 operators) and W3VD/3 (48 operators). SECRETARY'S REPORT

The regular monthly meeting of the TRW/ARC Executive Committee was called to order at 12 noon on Tuesday, May 15, 1973, by President Paul Weisz. Others present were: Carter, Halligan, Dean, Freeman, Dews, S. Kennedy, Koho, Wineman and A. Lee.

OLD BUSINESS

- 1. Club Call. Weisz announced that the club trustee anticipates the new club call sign to be available in time for Field Day activities.
- 2. Drake 2B. Dean announced that the Drake 2B receiver the club had intended to purchase did not meet all of the criteria, and will not be purchased.

NEW BUSINESS

- Oscar/AMSAT Test. Weisz indicated the club would support coming ground tests of the AMSAT.
- Station QSL Cards. Trapp's request for the purchase of more cards was deferred pending resolution of the club call. At that time, a "back order" will be placed to cover all station QSL obligations.
- 3. 40/20 Filters. Fred Reed is fabricating four filters for use on field day by the SSB/CW stations.
- 4. Code Table. Al Lee announced that further modifications of the new club code table have been suspended until the table has been found. The errant table was last seen in S-1480 just prior to converting that conference room to office space.
- 5. RACES TRAINING. Freeman stated that TRW/ARC has 10 certificated members in RACES and that special classes will be held within 6 weeks.
- 6. RACES Committee. Weisz announced that a committee has been formed to provide TRW/ARC coordinated support of RACES. Members are Freeman (chairman), Al Lee (Deputy), Rothrock, Weisz, Carter.
- 7. RACES Facilities. Freeman brought up the age old problem of inadequate facilities for station operations. He indicated he would coordinate with Trapp on additional requirements required for RACES support!
- 8. Teague's Bill. Heated discussion was heard over the merits of the Teague (electrical interference) bill. Since Dews brought the subject up, it was requested that a "letter-to-Editor" to highlight the subject would be in order.
- 9. Extra Class Classes. Al Lee has scheduled classes (Code and theory) for the Extra Amateur Radio License begins July 3rd, and running for 12 weeks. A motion was made (Dean) and seconded (Halligan) that the course be offered for \$5 for club members, with non-members paying \$7 (to include their club membership).



OSCAR VII

West Coast AMSAT plans an airplane overfly of the Breadboard Oscar VII transponder late this summer. The flight unit is now at JPL, and is a 10 Watt SSB/CW unit with a 50 KHz wide <u>inverting</u> transponder ratio (3/4 to 2 M). (Up 432.125 - 432.175, down 145.975 - 145.925). The breadboard unit is similar except power out is only 2-1/2 W PEP. Tenative dates for the airplane overfly are 25 August for shakedown in the local Southern California area and 8 September for flight from San Diego to San Francisco. This date of 8 September may change since that is also the VHF Contest weekend. I have transmit gear to allow WB6WPO particiapation on at least CW (and hopefully SSB by July), and am asking for volunteers to assemble a complete station (antennas, recorder, etc., and a CW operator, Hi).
