By the time you read this, Field Day will be upon us, if not already past. Our FD Managers, the team captains and others have put in many man-hours of planning and preparation for this event, and have done a great job. Hope to see you all at the site June 23/24.

At about this time of the year, it is customary to take stock of our position as a club, to see whether we have advanced or regressed. Membership is up 16 percent since December, from 104 (76 full, 28 associate) to 121 (86 full, 35 associate). Attendance at our meetings is up, from

Old Business

1. Field Day: Plans are all set for Field Day operations. Sue Kennedy made a call for help in serving food from XYL's. First Aid kits are

- available from Freeman. Back-up calls for Field Day are: W6FQ, K6YQ.
- 2. Teletype Facilities: J. Dean will coordinate implementation of RTTY equipment in the club shack. J. Wineman will investigate other possible sources of a suitable teletype receiver.
- 3. OSCAR/AMSAT Support: P. Weisz stated that the club would organize a support group for AMSAT activity after Field Day is completed.

New Business
