EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETING - April 12, 1977 By Jim Hill, W6IVW

The TRW ARC Executive Committee meeting was called to order in room M2-1825 at 12:02 PM by the president. The following people were present: President Bill Dews, K6AWO, Past President Frank Cartier, WA6RAY, Secretary Jim Hill, W6IVW, Trustee Paul Weisz, K6YQ, Cross Talk Assistant Editor Mel Erb, K6GWC, and Financial Team chairman Phil Presser, WB6MXE.

Copies of Cross Talk for ARRL

How many copies of Cross Talk should be sent to the ARRL? Past Editor Paul Weisz says one copy is adequate. It should be sent to the Communications Manager.

Cross Talk Advertizers

Phil Presser reported on the status of the plan to solicit paid advertizements for Cross Talk. His proposed rates are \$2.00 for a small "business card" size, \$6.00 for a half page, and \$10.00 for a full page. The full page cost would be reduced to \$6.00 if the advertizer supplied the page, ready to go. Phil discussed potential advertizers, and will start contacting them.

Cross Talk Miscellaneous

The reproduction quality of the mimeographed edition was considered inadequate, particularly when the typing effort (by Gary Komatsu) was considered. Phil Presser knows of a small garage type printer, and will contact him regarding costs. It was mentioned that the Tennis Club appears to have a low cost means of reproducing their bulletin, and Phil will contact them for details. The final date for inputs to Cross Talk was set at April 19, 1977.

Two Meter Oscar

Frank Cartier reports that the status is unchanged.

QSL Card Cost Reduction

Reducing QSL card costs by considering the company public relations value was discussed. Frank Cartier is in the process of contacting PR people.

Field Day

Initial plans were presented by Field Day Manager Frank Cartier. He has selected the Soleado Elementary School in Rancho Palos Verdes as the site. It's advantages include a good shot in all directions, especially to the North and East, a large field with a gate that can be locked for security, availability of rest rooms, and ease of getting permission (he knows the principal). Either a 6A or 7A classification will be selected, with 6A the most likely. The usual detailed Field Day information package will be prepared, but will be distributed to the Field Day group leaders to reduce repropoblems. He is looking into a solar power source, and will review other bonus point possibilities. Three meals, Saturday noon and night, and Sunday morning, are tentatively scheduled.

Club Station

The April 9 station maintenance activity was a flop, as there was a very poor showing. The tower is not in immediate danger of collapse, but the guy wires have seen better days. Another activity will be scheduled later.

One topic of this document is the proposed elimination of club station licenses. Paul Weisz will write a letter stating arguments against this proposal.

Activities Chairman Gary Komatsu, K6HPD, announced an April 9 work party to replace the club station antenna guy wires. Membership badges are available from him for \$1.50.

Training Manager Gary Cooper, WB6RLN, announced the readiness of the training program materials and asked for volunteer instructors.

Ed Thornley, W6RXD, mentioned the LA Times column relating to CB, and the instructions to write ARRL if CB'ers want to train for hamdom.

Cecil Jordon, the guest speaker, spoke on "Radio at 10,000 meters".

The meeting was adjourned at 1:05 PM.
