

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETING - November 8, 1977 By Jim Hill, W6IVW

The TRW ARC Executive Committee meeting was called to order in room M2-1825 at 12:04 by the president. The following people were present: President Bill Dews, K6AWO, Vice President Mel Erb, K6GWC, Secretary Jim Hill, W6IVW, Trustee Paul Weisz, K6YQ, Activities Manager Gary Komatsu, K6HPD, SEA Council Rep. Ferd Newhoffer, RACES Coordinator Wally Linstruth, WA6JPR, and Cross Talk Editor, Mac McGrew, K6RL.

The meeting agenda follows:

- Pettingell; TRW/ARC membership ARRL?? 50% or more to be affiliated The present club records don't provide current status regarding who is a member of ARRL. 51% or more of a club's membership must belong to ARRL for the club to qualify for ARRL membership. Our records need to be updated.
- No QSL cards for members Action Item

 No QSL cards are presently available for members, so don't send money
 for cards until further notice. A new staff position, QSL Card Manager,
 has been made, but is not filled at the present time. Any volunteers?
- 3. Linstruth; Local repeater and W6TRW ???? Wally pointed out that item 6 of the October 11 meeting minutes was incorrect, and updated us about the RACES repeater. The Los Angeles County RACES allocated 147.080 for area G (CPT-3) RACES. Severe interference from the Catolina repeater was experienced, and was minimized by moving to the lower end of the channel, 147.075. Efforts to get another frequency were unsuccessful, as the county does not follow current repeater allocation philosophies. The repeater is presently operational on 147.075-147.675. Wally financed and provided the repeater, and it is located at his house. It is usually running, but may be off depending upon his personal commitments. SCRA lists the repeater as a closed repeater for RACES, but TRW ARC members are encouraged to use it. Most RACES operation is presently on 147.075 simplex. Wally is considering looking for a better site. After some discussion, Paul was appointed to form a committee to look for a site, and to co-share or assist in the operation.
- Komatsu; Club badge at meeting; Door prize Sat 12; Gilmore photos
 Gary moved that \$25 be allocated for the Nov 12 door prize, but there was
 no second. After some discussion, he amended the motion to allocate \$50,
 and the motion was seconded by Paul. The motion carried unaminously.
 Gary will get the prizes (many small prizes, both mens and womens, instead
 of a few expensive prizes will be obtained). Bill will get the money and give
 it to Gary. The speaker(?) will be Dave Gilmore with color slides. An
 interesting evening should result, as Dave is an excellent photographer.
 It was suggested that Gary phone the ARRL and get the Field Day results.
 By selecting the proper time, a phone call will cost 85¢.
- 5. Weisz; new club officers Nov. election

 He is presently refining the list and contacting prospective candidates.


 The list should be finallized by the end of the week.

- 6. Erb; Dec. meeting Dec. 14th speaker
 An outside speaker is not needed, as the change of officers will occur at this meeting. The door prize is TBD.
- 8. McGrew; Cross Talk cut-off date
 The November issue cut-off date is November 18. The best method of sending ballots to eligible members (only) was discussed. Mel will coordinate with Frank Halligan.
- 9. <u>Cartier; Write eligibility by-law on associate membership</u>
 Tabled, as Cartier was not present.
- 10. Schrecengost; Contest and the club station W6TRW.

 Tabled, as Bill Schrecengost is out of town on business. Before leaving,
 Bill contacted Dews and said he is still interested, and will pursue it
 further when he returns.
- Next Staff/Executive meeting
 The next meeting is scheduled for December 6 (the first Tuesday in Dec.)
 at noon, in room M2-1825.
- 12. Gary moved to allocate \$25 for the AMSAT December 3 OSCAR shake down flight, this money to be sent to Skip Raymond, c/o Paso Robles Communications. After some discussion, it was decided that additional information is needed. The motion was not seconded.
