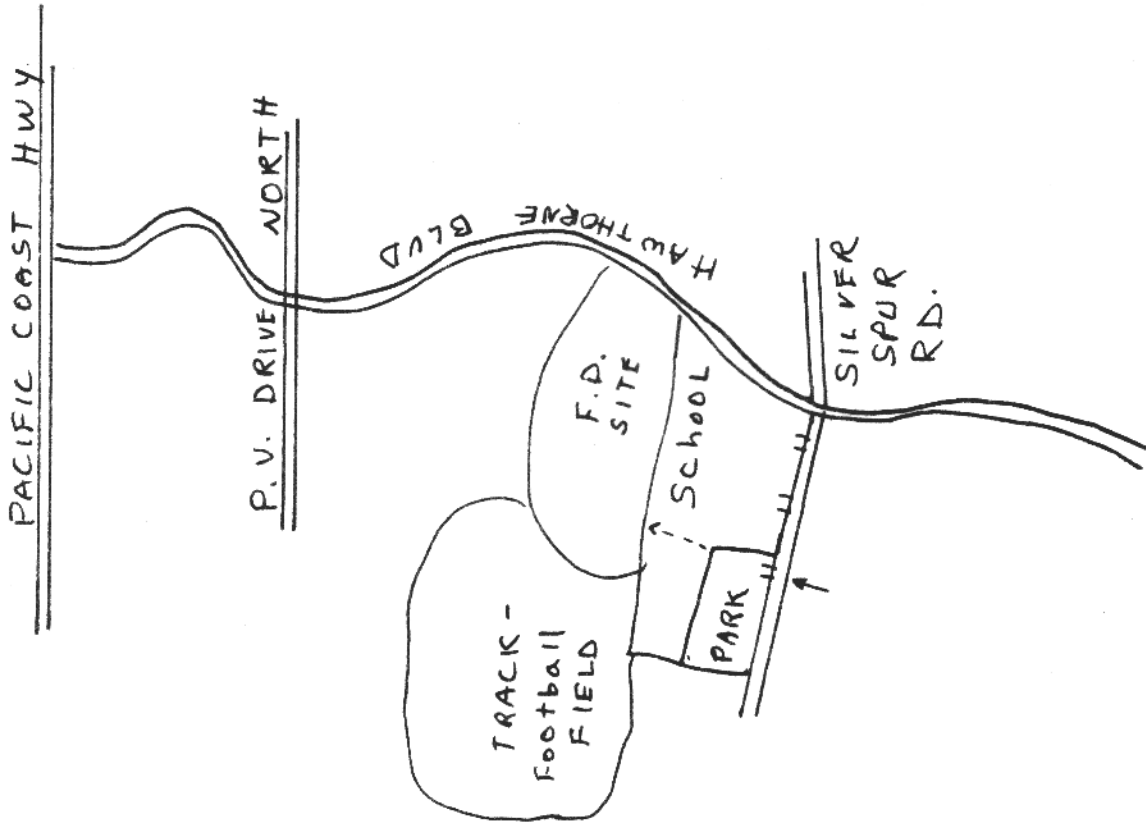

The big event takes place this coming weekend so I hope everyone is planning to participate in some way or another. If you are going to be at the site, I have information for all of you. Otherwise, everyone else can help by getting on the air and giving W6TRW/6 a call.

Set up time will begin around 7:30 or 8:00 on Saturday morning at the Rolling Hills High School, located at Hawthorne and Silver Spur Road in Rolling Hills. The athletic field we are using is located nearest to the classrooms and gymnasium. Do not drive onto the field unless you are using a RV to house your station. You can drive on to deliver your tent and equipment but otherwise plan on parking in the adjacent parking lot. Classroom M-15 has been made available to us so meet there if you want to volunteer to help.

Lou Cartier has the cooking and feeding details well organized with assistance from Alice Dews and Jan Lee and probably several others.

If you are planning to stay all night, be aware that the parking lot and access to the field will be locked from 11:30 PM until 7:00 AM. During this time, you can walk to or from the field through a round-about path.

We will be operating class 7A and have capability of transmitting on 16 bands so you can see that about half of the bands will be sharing operating time. Bill Dews, K6AWO will be handling the log sheets and determining which stations will be operating. Please cooperate with Bill because it becomes quite a task to organize all of this.

The novice station will be using Ralph Clark's new call KA6AVF/6 and will be operating continuously. The OSCAR station will try to meet all passes of OSCAR 7 and 8 in view of our site which also does not count as a separate band.

ATTENTION ARRL MEMBERS (and potential members)!
 Help the TRW ARC at no cost to yourself when renewing your ARRL membership or applying for membership. Here are the details.

Instead of sending the form and money directly to the ARRL, give them to our treasurer, Bill Ivey, WA6QET. He will forward them to the ARRL, and the club will receive \$1.50 per person renewing. The standard rates apply, which are: \$12 for the first year, \$11 for the second year, and \$10 for each succeeding year. For example, a five year membership would cost \$53.

Family memberships for immediate family members who live at the same address are available at \$2.00 per person. Family members don't receive QST (and the club doesn't receive a benefit).

Life memberships are available for \$240; contact the ARRL directly for details. The club does not receive benefits for life memberships.

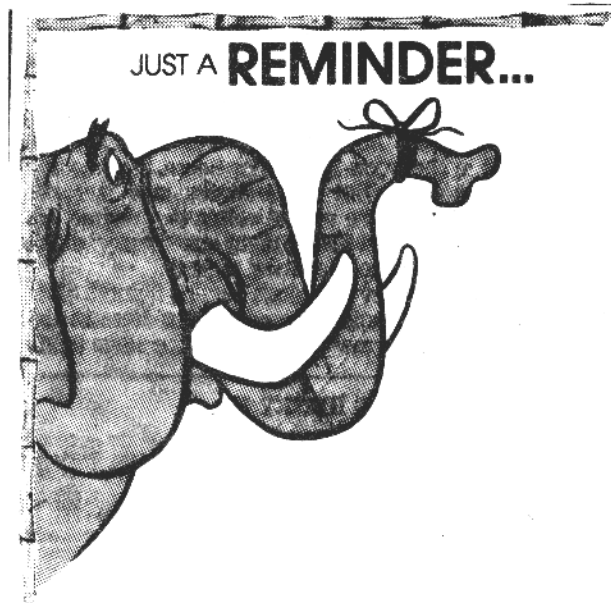

CREDIT FOR PASSING THE CW exam can now be retained by an FCC license applicant even though he failed the written test. In a decision reach Wednesday, the Commissioners agreed to allow an applicant such credit for up to one year after he takes an exam. To receive the CW credit the applicant will be given an FCC Form 845 by the Field Office at the time of the exam. He turns it in when he returns for another try and receives credit for the CW portion of the exam.

FORM 845 WILL BE HONORED only by the Field Office that issued it. The forms and instructions for their use have gone to all FCC Field Offices, and the Rules change becomes effective immediately. However, to be on the safe side, it would be wise to check with your local Field Office to see if they've implmented the new procedure before going in for an exam.
