A FUND FOR BENNIE

Many of our older members will remember reports about our Honorary Member, Benjamin Canaros. For the benefit of those who don't know, "Bennie" is a resident of the Philippine Islands, a young man befriended by the TRW/ARC some years ago.

Bennie's life has not been pleasant, to say the least. He spent a good part of his life in a Leper Colony on Culion Island in the Philippines. Although he doesn't have the disease, both of his parents died of it.

In order to make his own life better, Bennie developed an interest in electronics. He took a home study course (by mail - RCA institute) and has been able to leave the Colony with his wife and 5 children. At this time he is struggling to exist doing electronics servicing in Santa Maria in the Philippines.

Unfortunately, the stigma of leprosy hangs over Bennie. His business is poor because potential customers fear the disease.

In the past, the TRW/ARC has helped Bennie with donations of electronics parts, tools, books and clothing. His expressions of appreciation and joy have been heartwarming.

Once again, Bennie needs help. In a recent letter, he asked us for money to repair his house - \$125 to \$150.

At the meeting of the Executive Committee on 9 February, it was decided that individual donations from the club members would be an appropriate gesture and means to help Bennie.

In addition, the committee is asking the membership to vote on a proposal to add \$25 to the fund from the Club treasury.

How about it, fellow members - could you help with a dollar or two, or even five? A little bit from each of us would add up to a lot for Bennie and his family - and a nice way for us Hams to spread a little international good will.

ARRL DUES INCREASE

According to the Ham Radio Report, a 50% increase in dues is scheduled for this spring. Life memberships will increase a like amount. Renewals under the old rate are still being accepted. These rates are: 1 year-\$12, 2 years-\$23, 3 years-\$33, 4 years-\$43, and 5 years-\$53. If you plan to renew, why not renew through the TRW ARC? Your cost is unchanged, and the club receives a small rebate.

Send a check payable to the TRW Amateur Radio Club and the following information to James S. Hill, S-792 (or better still, phone me, x50345, for a form): Your name, address, call and license class (if any), and whether you want a membership card or certificate. To avoid duplicate magazines, it is recommended that those requesting renewals also include the address sticker from your QST wrapper. If you don't include the sticker, mention if you are requesting a new or renewal membership. Some, like myself, may be partially through an extended renewal, I'm writing to the ARRL for information, and will include it in the next edition of Cross Talk. Note: The February edition of QST does not mention a dues increase, so the decision must be quite recent.

Contact the ARRL directly for life memberships; the club rebate does not apply.
