

Many of us have operated FM on this band with crystal or synthesizer rig; a 2 - meter rig with the handling characteristics of a continuous-tuned HF-5513 transceiver is a different ball game. The specs for this rig are reproduced below. Operating instructions are in preparation and will be displayed at the operating positions in the near future.
