- 1. THE TRW/ARC WILL PARTICIPATE IN THE 1980 ARRL NATIONAL FIELD DAY ON JUNE 28 29 1980. IF YOU HAVE NOT SIGNED UP FOR THIS ANNUAL EVENT, CONTACT THE TEAM CAPTAIN OF YOUR CHOICE IMMEDIATELY.

- 3. THIS YEAR'S FIELD DAY SITE IS ONCE AGAIN THE NAVY FUEL DEPOT IN NORTH SAN PEDRO (SEE MAP).
- 4. ENTRANCE TO THE SITE IS ON GAFFEY STREET, NEAR THE POLICE PISTOL RANGE.
 ANNOUNCE YOUR DESTINATION AND PURPOSE TO THE GATE GUARD, AND FOLLOW
 THE SIGNS TO THE FIELD DAY SITE.
- 5. FINAL EQUIPMENT SETUP WILL BEGIN SATURDAY AT 0800 PDST: OPERATION IS SCHEDULED FOR 24 HOURS STARTING AT 1100 PDST ON SATURDAY 28 JUNE. SWITCH WILL BE PULLED AT 1100 PDST ON 29 JUNE, SO THAT ALL HANDS CAN RETURN HOME BY MID-AFTERNOON, AFTER TEARDOWN.
- 6. SATURDAY LUNCH AND DINNER, AND SUNDAY BREAKFAST AND LUNCH WILL BE PROVIDED, TOGETHER WITH BEVERAGES AND ASSORTED SNACKS. (PLEASE BRING ALONG SOME OF YOUR FAVORITE GOODIES TO SHARE: COOKIES, BROWNIES, CAKES, CANDIES, ETC.) NOBODY WILL GO HUNGRY OR THIRSTY!
- 7. IF YOU ARE PLANNING TO SPEND THE NIGHT AT THE SITE, BRING YOUR OWN SLEEP-ING FACILITIES. BRING EXTRA CHAIRS FOR SHADE AREAS - NEED ALL WE CAN FIND.
- 8. THERE IS A HEAVY GROWTH OF DRY GRASS AT AND AROUND OUR OPERATING SITE.

 FIRE PRECAUTIONS ARE VERY IMPORTANT. BOOTS OR HIGH SHOES ARE RECOMMENDED IF AVAILABLE.
- 9. THE CLUB WILL BE OPERATING WITH OUR STATION CALL, W6TRW. REMEMBER, YOU MUST OPERATE WITHIN BAND LIMITS FOR YOUR OWN LICENSE CLASS.
- 10. FCC REGS REQUIRE THAT YOU HAVE YOUR ORIGINAL LICENSE IN YOUR POSSESSION WHILE OPERATING: BRING IT!
- 11. OFFICIAL ARRL FIELD DAY RULES WERE PUBLISHED IN MAY QST. ALL PARTICIPANTS SHOULD READ THEM.
- 12. ALL CONTACTS WILL BE LOGGED ON CLUB LOG SHEETS, WHICH WILL BE PROVIDED.

 THE LOG SHEETS WILL RECORD THE ESSENTIAL ELEMENTS OF EACH QSO, AND BASIC DATA ON OPERATION OF THE STATION: SEE THE ATTACHED EXAMPLE.

- A. DATE, BAND, MODE, XMTR, RCVR, ANTENNA, POWER (SAME FOR ALL CONTACTS ON SHEET).
- B. FOR EACH QSO:

TIME: 24-HOUR PDST (0000 - 2359)

STATION WORKED

HIS ARRL SECTION

HIS REPORT TO YOU

HIS CLASS (E.G. 6A)

YOUR SIGNATURE AND CALL SIGN/LOGGER'S SIGNATURE


A FRESH LOG SHEET SHOULD BE STARTED EACH HOUR, ON THE HOUR. THEY WILL BE PICKED UP HOURLY.

- 13. DUPE SHEETS WILL BE PROVIDED AT EACH OPERATING POSITION. THE LOGGER OR OPERATOR SHOULD ENTER THE CALL SIGN OF EACH STATION WORKED IN THE APPROPRIATE COLUMN, SO THAT THE SHEET CAN BE SCANNED TO SEE IF A CALLING STATION HAS BEEN WORKED BEFORE.
- 14. A TENTATIVE SCHEDULE FOR STATION OPERATION IS ATTACHED. WE ARE COMPETING THIS YEAR IN CLASS 6A: UP TO SIX RIGS ON SIMULTANEOUSLY, POWER INPUT 200 WATTS OR LESS. THIS IS A SOMEWHAT MORE COMPETITIVE CATEGORY THAN CLASS 7A, AND A HIGH LEVEL OF EFFICIENCY WILL BE REQUIRED IF WE ARE TO MAKE A GOOD SHOWING.
- 15. WE HOPE TO HAVE A SATELLITE TERMINAL IN OPERATION AT THE SITE, SO THAT WE CAN MAKE FIELD DAY CONTACTS VIA OSCAR 7 OR 8. WE WILL ALSO MAKE SOME CONTACTS USING "NATURAL POWER".
- 16. DURING A FIELD DAY EXCHANGE, GIVE SIGNAL REPORT, OPERATING CLASS (6A) AND YOUR (LOS ANGELES) ARRL SECTION. GET OTHER STATION'S CALL, REPORT TO YOU, CLASS AND ARRL SECTION.
- 17. IF YOU HAVE ANY QUESTIONS, CONTACT ONE OF THE FIELD DAY TEAM CAPTAINS.

FIRE SAFETY RULES

- 1. SIGHT IS COVERED WITH DRY GRASS. NO SMOKING EXCEPT IN DESIGNATED AREAS.
- 2. EACH STATION MUST HAVE A BUCKET OF WATER OR A FIRE EXTINGUISHER.
- 3. GOOD HOUSEKEEPING RULES ARE IN EFFECT. TRASH IN CONTAINERS ETC.
- 4. NO VEHICLES WITH CATALYTIC CONVERTERS WILL BE ALLOWED AT THE SIGHT.

 THERE WILL BE SHUTTLE VEHICLES TO TRANSPORT YOU FROM THE PARKING AREA.



FIELD DAY ADDENDUM

Starting about 23 May, the week before Field Day, the Fuel Depot facility will be operated by the Mercury Refueling Co., under contract to the Navy. This imposes a couple of new constraints on us:
