SHACK WORK PARTY COMING UP



TECHNICAL CORNER

(This tip has passed through several newsletters, most recently the Hughes ARC publication. Bill Schreck plans to make the addition to his equipment.)

Did you ever think what might happen to that expensive rig in your car if the voltage regulator went out? Modern alternators can put out more than 35 volts if uncontrolled. This would fry most rigs, even if only applied for a few seconds. The following idea for protecting your rig was found in the Jackson Michigan Mini-Mag. All that is needed is a 15-volt, 10 watt Zener diode and fuse that you probably already have.

12-volt systems operate at around 13.8 volts and should not get much above 14 volts. The device works like this: If the voltage rises above 15 volts, the Zener fires and attempts to bring the voltage down. As it does, it draws more and more current until the fuse blows. The Zener may be destroyed, but that is a small price to pay for saving your rig.

WHAT IS YLRL, ANYWAY?--Phyllis Gilmore, KA6NFD

The Young Ladies Radio League is a worldwide assosciation of women in amateur radio. Its purposes are to encourage and assist YLs throughout the world to become Hams; to promote YL interest, appreciation, and understanding of radio communication and to improve their skills as operators; to assist handicapped YLs; to provide a scholarship fund for YLs who wish to pursue academic subjects related to communications and electronics; to host foreign YLs and sponsor their participation in YLRL activities; and to encourage competition between YLs by offering awards in operating competitions. YLRL has, for example, its own WAS award. Its currently bi-monthly publication is YL Harmonics, and it conducts a number of networks on the low bands (some of them carefully timed for when the OM is elsewhere!). Local YL clubs and the annual YLRL convention, as well as get-togethers at ARRL conventions, provide ample opportunity for eyeball QSOs.
