### TRWARC SWAPMEET Manager Duties

- Prepare the full year Duty Roster listing swapmeet booth operators on duty for the respective months.
- 2) Recruit new operators to replace operators who have resigned.
- Publish the names of operators who have monthly swapmeet booth duty in the Crosstalk Newsletter the month prior to the duty.
- Prepare "Swapmeet" article for monthly crosstalk.
- Notify, by telephone and mail each swapmeet operator who has duty, one week prior to his duty and advise him of the task he is assigned.
- 6) Substitute or switch monthly operator assignments where personal conflicts exist (occurs nearly every month).
- Order and pick up donuts at Dunkin Donuts, ice and milk, on the morning of the swapmeet and deliver to the swapmeet site by 7:15 am.
- 8) Supervise the Swapmeet Booth Team and assist with operation of the swapmeet booth as needed.
- 9) Train new operators and assist same in loading swapmeet supplies/ equipment at Bldg. 65.
- Patrol swapmeet grounds during the swapmeet to verify the swapmeet is operating peacefully, lawfully, and not misusing site parking.
- 11) Count cash proceeds at the end of the swapmeet and deliver to the treasurer.
- Repro "Swapmeet Rules" sheet (300 copies) each month for distribution at swapmeet.
- Buy refreshment supplies each month for swapmeet use (coffee, soft-drinks, etc.).
