Note: The Hawthorne session dates correspond with the last Saturday of every odd month. This is the same weekend as the TRW SWAP-MEET in Redondo Beach (about 5 miles away).

Subnote: This is true for every session except the one in November, which is one week earlier.

## **Hawthorne Location:**

- Northrop Cafeteria at 12329 Crenshaw Blvd., Hawthorne, CA Just south of the Fire Station and the Hawthorne Airport.
- From the 405 Freeway take El Segundo Blvd. off-ramp Eastbound.
- From the 110 Freeway take El Segundo Blvd. off-ramp Westbound.
- El Segundo Blvd. to Crenshaw Blvd. Northbound.
- Cross railroad tracks and first traffic light: Northrop Ave.
- Second traffic light is crosswalk/parking lot entrance: Gate 17
- Park at Gate 17 (East side of Crenshaw Blvd.)
- Examination Building is at Gate 16 (West side of Crenshaw Blvd.)
