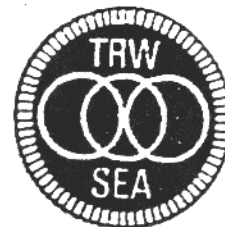

## TRW/ARC Ancient History Department - Chapter 5

Doug Heydon, WB6WDS was re-elected President of the club for 1969.

A number of activities were continued and/or planned for the new year and the club made a lot of progress.

Improvements to the club station WB6WPO in Building 65 were made and many members contributed to the efforts as well as keeping our station on the air. We had planned to get our two 60 ft towers equipped with a beam and wire antennas. Our plans were interrupted by a temporary closure of the building for major remodeling. The shutdown silenced WB6WPO for about three months and delayed completing our antenna installations, but we did get the station back on the air in the fall using our HF vertical.

Field Day planning started early in the year with Doug Freeman, WA6AZW heading the club's efforts. Doug and his committee selected a site on the Palos Verdes Peninsula with a good eastern "exposure" and high on the hill. Field Day was held on June 28-29 and turned out to be a great affair for the club. We operated in Class 6A - six stations in the Club category - and logged 2395 contacts. That totaled 17,596 points, a big increase over our 1968 score. Operations covered 10 different bands, with no more than six stations on at any one time. Doug expertly controlled the operations so that we could maximize the activities as a function of band activities. When the final results were published in the November issue of QST, the club was pleased to end up in second place in Class 6A. We were first in that class in California. Very fine results for our second time out as a club.

The club also participated in the TRW Family Day on September 6. We set up operations on the R5 Patio and worked on four bands. We logged 60 contacts including sending 34 messages for other TRW Employees and their guests. Family Day was a well-attended event, giving employees a chance to bring family members and friends for a tour of Space Park and many of its labs were open for demonstrations and exhibits of interest to the visitors. Our demonstration of Amateur Radio on-the-air attracted a lot of attention. We had the pleasure of showing our communications skills to Dr. Rueben Mettler and his family during the event.

Further efforts to affiliate with ARRL were made but we just couldn't quite qualify. Arm-twisting of the membership continued to get more people to join ARRL, as we fell just short of the necessary 51 percent of the membership belonging to qualify as an affiliated club.

Nobody was hungry in 1969 so we were not able to schedule our "Annual Hamfeast". The "Annual Hamfeast" was rescheduled for 1970. I guess that made it a "Bi-Annual Hamfeast"!
