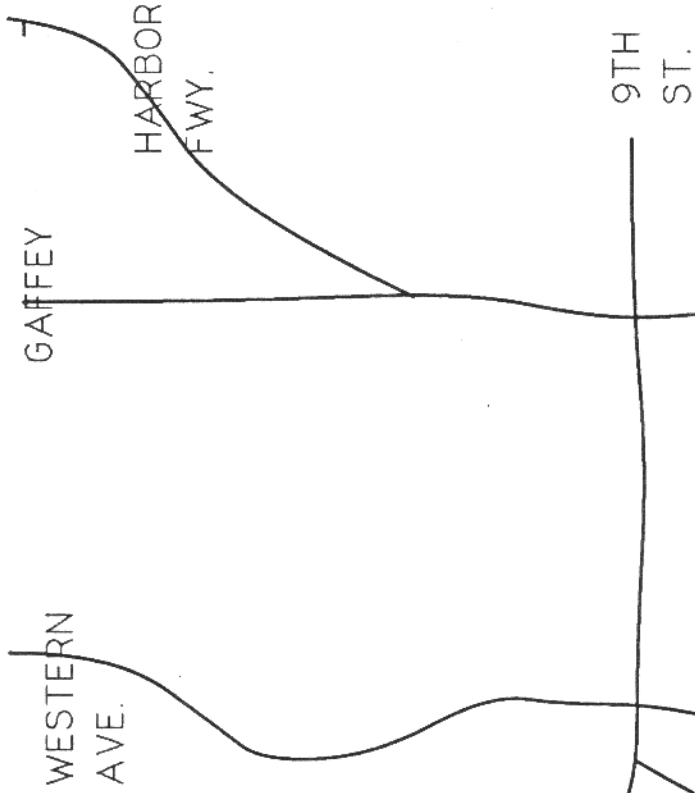

At the ending point, we'll tell you how to purchase or build your own sniffer for less than \$30.00, and demonstrate other equipment that can be used to help improve your odds of finding that tricky rabbit.
