You may have noticed the W6TRW 447.000 repeater off once in awhile. It may be turned off sometimes because of an unlicensed operator using our repeater. If you hear someone identifying themselves as KG6IRO on our club repeaters, please note the date and time of the transmission and send it to Jim K6OUE at <a href="mailto:im.harrison@ngc.com">im.harrison@ngc.com</a>. I am keeping a log of these transmissions for possible future use. Note that KG6IRO is <a href="mailto:not">not</a> a valid call-sign, so do not reply to this person.

#### Our 447 repeater control operator, Duane WA6EIK, adds:

"Due to the on-going activities of this individual and someone attempting to access the repeater controller functions, the repeater although fully functional, is completely locked out to user functions such as the autopatch and other control operator functions. Please do not attempt to access the autopatch at this time, and DO NOT respond or even mention hearing the person identifying himself as KG6IRO. By acknowledging him in any way perpetuates his activity and he then knows he has a captive audience."

#### Space Hams Net Still Going Strong

If you listen to the W6TRW 2m repeater at all, I am sure you have heard the Space Hams Net on Thursday evenings. This net has been going strong for many years due to the hard work and dedication of its hosts Ronni N6SHI and Stan W6EKK. In fact the only times there has not been a net is when Thursday happens to fall on a major holiday like Thanksgiving or Christmas eve. Stan is a retiree from TRW and is still consulting with NGST in spacecraft test and integration. Ronni is not an employee, but works close to Space Park for the FAA. Her call sign signifies her association with Space Hams International. Together they host the net, Stan from his home in Gardena, Ronni from her home in the Hollywood Hills.

The net covers items of interest to space enthusiasts and radio amateurs including: space launches in the US and other countries, the status of the Space Shuttle and the International Space Station, amateur radio satellites, news from NASA and JPL, and amateur radio operation from the Shuttle or ISS. They also give all of the times for the next week when the ISS will pass over southern California so you can try to see it go overhead or make radio contact with it. They usually give some pass times for popular amateur radio satellites. And they give the times and locations in the sky of Iridium flares, the brief flashes of sunlight that reflect off of the antennas on the constellation of Iridium satellites. These flashes look almost like flash bulbs going off in the sky and can be quite a thrill to see in the evening or early morning.

So, if you haven't heard the Space Hams Net, give a listen any Thursday evening at 7PM on the W6TRW 2m repeater. Listeners can also check in just to let Ronni and Stan know your listening, or if you have some space related news to contribute to the net, or have questions about operating amateur satellites.

Thank you Ronni and Stan for keeping this great net going for all of the hams in southern California and the non-ham space enthusiasts who listen in for the latest space news.
